

## 12<sup>th</sup> Organisational Behaviour in Health Care (OBHC) Conference 15-17 April 2020, Manchester, UK

This biennial conference, the flagship event of the <u>Society for Studies in Organizing Healthcare</u> (<u>SHOC</u>), brings together word-leading scholars in the organisation of healthcare to share the latest advances in research. It will be hosted by <u>Alliance Manchester Business School</u>.

'Managing Healthcare Organisations in Challenging Policy Contexts: Integration or Fragmentation?'

We aim to investigate how contemporary policy trends, which are often infused with internal tensions and contradictions, are influencing healthcare systems, organisations and professions. We will also explore the various ways in which policy implementation could be enacted, resisted and reinvented by healthcare managers and professionals on the ground.

## **Oral presentations**

We welcome both empirical and conceptual full papers (up to **6,000 words** excluding references and tables) grounded in various disciplinary and methodological traditions.

All submissions meeting the conference requirements will undergo double-blind peer review. They will be assessed based on their originality, rigour, critical thinking, relevance to organisation of healthcare, and potential to make a strong contribution to theoretical and/or practical knowledge.

<u>As in previous years</u>, we will seek to publish selected papers from the conference in an edited book and a special issue of *Journal of Health Organization and Management*.

### Registration

Registration will open in December 2019.

Provisional early bird registration fee is £530 for academics and £230 for PhD students, including the pre-conference drinks reception at Alliance MBS on 14th April and conference dinner in the National Football Museum on 16th April 2020.

Bursaries for PhD students will also be available.
